DR KUHN: I'm a little confused at this 1 point and, like Dr. Pullen, with a gentleman like Mr. 2 Eney around, I'm not going to pose as a lawyer, but I 3 wonder if this isn't basically talking about free speech? 4 Doesn't this cover it in the broader sense, whether it's 5 in the --6 MRS, FREEDLANDER: We generally think of the 7 Bill of Rights as protecting an individual. Я DR. KUHN: I see what you mean; an institution 9 versus an individual. 10 MRS, FREEDLANDER: Or the government, as far 11 as the United States Bill of Rights protects you against 12 government interference. 13 DR. KUHN: I can only say this. Anything of 14 this type which tends to insure the continuing freedom 15 of the institution would be helpful. It's been amazing 16 to me living in the midst of -- my work has often been 17 with the physical and fiscal aspects of the growth of 18 the university. This is where you attempt to get con-19 trol. Seldom any more will there be a real assault on 20 academic freedom and, if it comes, you can usually get 21
