it properly looked at and it is not really, you know, where the institution is controlled.

The University of North Carolina is one of the only recent ones I have seen where there was a tendency of taking the matter of free speech, bringing speakers in and starting to control the university, but it successfully worked out of this in a short while this past year. It would be wonderful to have it, whether the whole attitude of the people of this State is such that it is not needed. This would be a question you might want to look at.

MRS. FREEDLANDER: Thank you.

THE CHAIRLADY: I would like, if we may, to get down to some more pedestrian and less idealistic concerns and call on Dr. Zimmerman at this point who is, I understand, an expert on the practical workings of Section 52, the budget provisions regarding the inviolacy of the school funds, because our Committee is somewhat confused as to how it actually works; not whether it is desirable or not as an abstract proposition, but exactly what it accomplishes and what would happen if we saw fit
