these provisions in effect. The Constitution should provide for the establishment of a nonpartisan lay State Board of Education to head the central education agency. This board should be empowered to, one, appoint the chief State school officer, two, exercise general supervision of the education in the State, three, coordinate educational activity in the State, four, formulate general education policies, rules and regulations within the framework of the statutes of the State.

Also the Constitution should provide that the chief State school officer be designated as, one, executive officer of the State Board, administrative head of the State Department of Education, administrative officer of the State for executing the laws, rules and regulations relating to education which arise under the State Constitution, State statutes or policies of the State Board of Education.

Now, I don't subscribe to each of those as I read them, but I have prepared a section for making the State Board a part of the Constitution and I have copies for you. If you want me to read them, I would suggest
