it because, as Dr. Pullen pointed out, not in recent times, but in times past the State school funds in other states where they didn't have this constitutional protection have been diverted to other uses. It's easy to get money for public schools and appropriations. You get a big appropriation and then if you proceed to divert it or amend the budget to transfer it, and the legislature can do this, this is not good; and you may say, well, why protect the public schools?

Well, I think that the point here is if the legislature appropriates funds for the operation and maintenance of public schools, we should make sure that those funds are used for that purpose and, if there is a surplus, it ought to revert to the State. It ought not to be diverted.

We do have surpluses each year because, as Dr. Pullen pointed out, we cannot estimate accurately what it is going to cost to operate the public schools throughout the State, as far as State aid is concerned. Sometimes we have a million dollars surplus, sometimes two, but that goes back to the State. We only spend for
