other than payment of salaries.

DR. ZIMMERMAN: That's in the Cooper Revision.

It's a part of the over-all personnel.

DR. BARD: Mr. Eney, if you substitute for equalization State aid laws --

MR. ENEY: I'm old-fashioned, using the old terms.

DR. BARD: Then it goes beyond. It would embrace the illustration I gave and others. Then you would by all means be active in --

DR. ZIMERMAN: Now, we have equalization and incentive on top of that. They will support 45 professional employees per thousand students. Then from 45 to 50, they will offer incentive aid by giving you that percentage of State aid which you got for the basic part. In other words, if the State was putting up 30 per cent of the cost of the basic program of 45 per thousand, they would support 30 per cent of the 45 to 50; but if you employ more than 50 per thousand, then you are on your own.
