DR. ZIMMERMAN: Well, I think we need a board to make policies. I think that is the purpose of a board, not as advisor to the State. I don't think we want to make the State Superintendent a power unto himself. He needs the board to make policies for him. The State Superintendent has no right to make policy. He makes a recommendation after a study to the board and then the State Board makes policy.

I think this is the way it should be. should be a delicate balance between the executive who is the State Superintendent and the State Board which in effect is the legislative arm of the State school system. No, I don't think that would be good, because I think we need lay policy-making boards to help us make policy. There is always the danger, when you place too much power in the hands of one person -- and this is no reflection on Dr. Pullen or anyone.
