says, well, we'll just cut so many million dollars out of that per pupil allotment or State aid, even though the law says that we are going to be guaranteed this, when it comes to be paid, if the funds are not there, we are hurt. We can't carry out our local rights because we have submitted budgets locally with the State support that is guaranteed by law. So, certainly it has got to be kept in, so the budget people or the legislature cannot just arbitrarily cut money that would support the provisions of the finance laws that are there. That's about all I have to say.

THE CHAIRLADY: I would like to ask you at least one question, which you may not want to answer.

I would regard it perhaps as a hot question, but coming from the county superintendents group, there are a number of state constitutions which make specific provision or prohibition against the use of state funds either directly or indirectly in support of secular schools, either stating explicitly that they cannot be used for transportation and stating explicitly they cannot be used for any purpose. I know this has been an issue in
