The ninth question is a study of how other states have solved the problem of the creation of new units of local government.

That will tie in a great deal, of course, with questions 2 and 3. Nevertheless, I think we may well want to, as we move with questions 2 and 3, give further assignment, so that we boil it down to the pinpointing of solutions which have been adopted insofar as other states in solving the problem of local government creation,

MR. THOMPSON: Mr. Chairman, I am not certain exactly what is meant by units of local government, but I know one interpretation which might be placed upon it would be to include new town legislation, for example. Now, this does exist in other states.

I think it is extremely important in the State of Maryland at this time. We have already seen the problems created by the development of an area such as Columbia, in Howard County. What should be its form of government? It seems to me that any constitutional provision should at least be of sufficient breadth and scope
