Council, may I say first that we thank you for the privilege of coming to this meeting. Unfortunately, through a misunderstanding, we did not find out about this until a late date and therefore at this particular time we are not prepared to make any statement.

We came to get an education, so to speak, and hear the views. We have from time to time noted -- and this has dated back over the years -- our concern for a constitutional convention because of the changes, the threat to the articles pertaining to education. So, this has been of concern to us for a number of years. What I would specifically like to ask at this time, in speaking with Mr. Brooks, I was told that we could come in at a little later date with any recommendations or a position paper. What is the time element involved here?

THE CHAIRLADY: Well, the time element is fairly close on making decisions on basic policies, in any event. I believe Mr. Eney is trying to have the basic recommendations in by April. Isn't that correct, Mr. Eney?

MR. ENEY: If we can.
