model state constitution which was drawn by the National Municipal League. It gives a rather brief statement in connection with support of higher education, and I think that from that could flow some of the ideas that we desire, particularly since we would like the statement to be brief.

In connection with county units, and this is my final point, it seems to me that we need to clarify somewhere the relationship of the county units to the State's responsibilities in education. This has come up. Mr. Eney has raised it, Mr. Sartorius and Dr. Zimmerman have raised it. In doing this, I would call your attention to the fact that Baltimore City's Department of Education sustains a rather unique relationship here and, if you go through the Constitution, you will note that the relationship is somewhat different than that in the county.

To some degree, the history of education in the State, wherein the Baltimore City Department of Education was really established before the State Department of Education, which was the reason for this
