right to jury trial in all civil cases involving \$20 or more, probably should not be incorporated.

In addition, care should be taken, in flexible language and non-meticulous idiom such as found in and under the Federal Constitution, to take account of other personal and civil rights, such as the right against wiretapping, that are not yet contemplated by the Federal Constitution.

The Maryland Branch of the American Civil
Liberties Union further takes the position that formulation of the new Declaration of Rights should avoid
prolix detail, be cast in flexible language and contemplate an important role for judicial implementation and
interpretation. Thank you.

THE CHAIRMAN: Professor Rosen, as to the provision on double jeopardy, would you suggest that the Bill of Rights embody the Federal standards of double jeopardy as it exists now? Do you feel generally there should be a specific provision involving double jeopardy?

PROFESSOR ROSEN: I think the thrust of the ACLU's position is that initially the Bill of Rights, or

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
