2 MRS. FREEDLANDER: You are speaking of  
3 Articles 1, 4, 6 and 7?

4 MR. BURGESS: Right, at this particular  
5 moment.

6 MRS. FREEDLANDER: Thank you.

7 MR. BURGESS: And I certainly would urge that  
8 these be included, and it is right interesting, if you  
9 study through these amendments, and I'm not going to take  
10 the time to do this --

11 THE CHAIRMAN: Well, I think we should for  
12 the record indicate what they are.

13 MR. BURGESS: Well, Article 1 -- well,  
14 particularly the ones that you mentioned in your own  
15 outline, 1, 4, 6 and 7.

16 THE CHAIRMAN: Article 1, That all government  
17 of right originates from the people, is founded in com-  
18 pact only, and instituted solely for the good of the  
19 whole; and they have, at all times, the inalienable  
20 right to alter, reform or abolish their form of govern-  
21 ment in such manner as they may deem expedient.
