

1 government, et cetera. All right.

2 MR. BURGESS: And for this purpose, of course,
3 elections are to be free and frequent, and every white
4 male citizen -- of course, we would not want to continue
5 the white male.

6 THE CHAIRMAN: You don't want to. Thank you.

7 MR. BURGESS: I believe that has already been
8 taken care of, in 1956. So, I don't know why they didn't
9 change it in my copy, or maybe I don't have an up-to-date
10 copy.

11 THE CHAIRMAN: One time they had a problem
12 where slavery was abolished, and I was rather sensitive
13 at the full Commission hearing that someone would vote
14 against continuing the abolishment of slavery, but we
15 made it.

16 MR. BURGESS: I have a memo about that, too.
17 I would also call to your attention that in the Consti-
18 tution of 1864, that this was included and deleted, of
19 course, in 1867, as Article 1, that we hold it to be
20 self-evident that all men are created equally free, that
21 they are endowed by their Creator with certain
