3 THE CHAIRMAN: I would like to read into the
4 record a note from Furman L. Templeton, of the Baltimore
5 Urban League. He states:

6 "I have before me a copy of the Connecticut
7 Constitution as approved October 28, 1965, by its
8 Constitutional Convention and submitted to the electorate
9 for a December 14, 1965 vote.

10 "Insofar as civil rights are concerned, the
11 Connecticut document would seem to cover the subject in
12 Section 1 and Section 20 of Article 1, Declaration of
13 Rights.

14 "Section 1 reads: 'All men when they form a
15 social compact, are equal in rights; and no man or set
16 of men are entitled to exclusive public emoluments or
17 privileges from the community.'

18 "Section 20 reads: 'No person shall be
19 denied the equal protection of the law nor be subjected
20 to segregation or discrimination in the exercise or
21 enjoyment of his civil or political rights because of
