look ahead, as you suggest, and this is a different point
which we are straddling. If you look ahead, it will be
more and more of a bureaucratic society, where more and
more decision making will be made by boards, as they are
today, various regulatory commissions and boards that
make decisions.

Now, the last Constitution has a provision
that protects the citizens on the power of investigatory

that protects the citizens on the power of investigatory commissions of the executive and legislative branch, which protects the people, which they don't currently have.

MR. SYKES: Are you sure of it?

MRS. FREEDLANDER: In most state constitutions,

aside from Alaska. For instance, Alaska states the right of all persons to fair and just treatment in the course of legislative investigation shall not infringed upon.

This is one of the bill of rights put out by the Municipal League. Is this the kind of provision you think we should consider in looking ahead?

MR. SYKES: I think the due process clause and the general attitude of the courts toward administrative
