2 MR. SYKES: I don't say it can't be done.

3 THE CHAIRMAN: I was waiting for you to con-
4 test that. You are a lawyer.

5 MR. SYKES: I'm not saying it can't be done
6 or, in fact, that it should be tried. I'm saying to you
7 the best way to find out whether it can be done is to
8 try it. I wouldn't confess that it is impossible in
9 advance. I just don't know and I think that maybe you
10 can let some of the non-lawyers and the lawyers spend
11 time until they have convinced themselves, a, that it
12 can be done, it's worthwhile or, b, that it isn't worth
13 the effort.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Lawyers use the standard test,
15 is it legally enforceable.

16 MR. SYKES: No, you don't have to --

17 THE CHAIRMAN: This is not the proper standard
18 I am not restricting it to that. I am restricting it to
19 the question of how useful -- I am discussing the ques-
20 tion of what would be the effect of incorporating
21 specific provisions which are not legally enforceable,
