phrases that are not legally enforceable, outside of a 1 preamble to the Constitution, and that rather leads me 2 into your question, how long should a constitution last. 3 Being one who teaches Federal constitutional law basically, my basic reaction to that is as long as it possibly can 5 keep going without falling of its own weight, and I feel if you encumber a constitution with phrases of nice 7 beliefs or thoughts, that it runs the risk of falling 8 of its own weight. 9

The genius of the American Federal Constitution is the fact that it is considered supreme law, the highest law of the land and enforceable as such. It distinguishes it. I am sure that is not the reason alone of the fall of the four -- or is it three? How many French republics have they had?

MR. SYKES: We're up to five.

PROFESSOR ROSEN: The second -- perhaps not the second, but the third and fourth, but their constitutions, as I understand it, were constitutions of nice phrases, of general statements that were not enforceable by the judiciary.
