in the Constitution. It is very important to us, for instance, to know your views with respect to the constitutional provisions as to the Executive Department, as to the counterbalancing of the legislative versus the executive, judiciary, and so forth. So, don't feel 5 The guidelines that are here are merely 6 starters, more than anything else. 7 I am sure you all know Dr. Bard and, without 8

more ado, I will turn the meeting over to you, Harry.

THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Vernon. I would like to make just a few brief remarks and then I think we can dig right into our assignment. First let me reiterate what Mr. Eney, our Commission Chairman, has said, namely that we are deeply grateful to all of you for being here and I might add we are also very grateful to you for furthering the powers of this Commission in making certain that certain bills were passed that put us into motion.

Today we shall be largely concerned with questions that were put together by the Committee on the Legislative Department. Now, while it is true that most
