

1 in the Constitution. It is very important to us, for
2 instance, to know your views with respect to the con-
3 stitutional provisions as to the Executive Department,
4 as to the counterbalancing of the legislative versus
5 the executive, judiciary, and so forth. So, don't feel
6 hampered. The guidelines that are here are merely
7 starters, more than anything else.

8 I am sure you all know Dr. Bard and, without
9 more ado, I will turn the meeting over to you, Harry.

10 THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Vernon. I would
11 like to make just a few brief remarks and then I think
12 we can dig right into our assignment. First let me
13 reiterate what Mr. Eney, our Commission Chairman, has
14 said, namely that we are deeply grateful to all of you
15 for being here and I might add we are also very grateful
16 to you for furthering the powers of this Commission in
17 making certain that certain bills were passed that put
18 us into motion.
