in at any point here on Question 1, by all means feel free to do so. We are not dealing in any order, gentlemen, so just come in whenever you choose to on this question before we leave it for Question 2.

We are lingering on this question a bit longer because, as Senator James has said, this is a key question.

DELEGATE MOORE: I would like to say, Doctor, that I concur, I think, generally, in the remarks of Senator Curran, although I know we are all very much influenced by the comments of Senator James, President of the Senate, who has served for so long in both houses. I think I feel, too, the importance of a check and balance system. Senator James has suggested this could be built into a unicameral setup. This I would like to have further comment on, if we have time.

I think, too, that while I state that I am in concurrence with the idea of keeping the present system, I think it should also be understood that the present system needs improvement and that one of the things which Senator James referred to, the matter of legislative services and full-time positions, these are
