can show a clear and good need for any expense to them,

I think that the decision and the presumption should be
against its adoption.

Furthermore, and this is with particular emphasis upon Senator Curran's remarks, I hope that you will not be a status quo body. I would like to see the Constitution of Maryland be for generations and for ages and status quos we've had with us for a long time and I think we would do the best job for the people of this State if we operate in the abstract in terms of what is true of the best and most inexpensive form of effective government, and I believe that a unicameral legislature would be such a legislature.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Mandel, would you care to comment on this particular subject?

DELEGATE MANDEL: The comment on the expense kind of makes me wonder, because we could have a totalitarian form of government that would be less expensive, too, but I don't think that is what you are looking for. I think, as an ancillary to this question, I think what you ought to think about is the size of the legislature,
