matter of size. Our Committee has given it a good deal of attention and, as you know, the size varies throughout the country from bodies well over 400, in some cases, to some bodies that are rather small, 50, 75. Would you 4 want to comment on what you would consider to be an 5 ideal size under either circumstance, unicameral or 6 bicameral? If you move to that question now, we will 7 come back to the other later. 8 DELEGATE MANDEL: I don't think the size of 9 the Senate is unwieldy, as it is right now. I think --10 SENATOR JAMES: You mean 29 or 43? 11 DELEGATE MANDEL: The 43 will be. I don't 12 think this is particularly unwieldy, but I think the 142-13 member House is a little too big. 14

THE CHAIRMAN: What would you suggest as to --DELEGATE MANDEL: I think if you had 100

members of the House and 43 senators, or even 50 senators, I wouldn't think that this would be out of line, but I

SENATOR JAMES: Senator Hughes wants to know

think that the 100-man House would certainly serve --

if you will go for 53?
