

1 rather than going into areas or metropolitanism or regional-
2 ism. We're holding onto the county, city as the basic
3 political unit with a flexibility to the legislature to
4 create new units in the form of other civil divisions,
5 subdivisions. However, it seems to me clear that if the
6 purpose of meeting the responsibility of local legisla-
7 tion is met at the local level and the General Assembly
8 is freed of that responsibility, then a unicameral legis-
9 lature is all that is needed because, as you will be able
10 to pinpoint the responsibility for your local legislation
11 of the man who is supposed to act upon it, similarly,
12 you will be able to pinpoint the responsibility for
13 Statewide problems on those persons that you send down
14 there to act upon them.

15 THE CHAIRMAN: If I cut you short here, it's
16 because we want to make sure we move along and, Hal, I
17 certainly appreciate your comments. Let's open up --

18 SENATOR CURRAN: As a followup on that, let
19 me throw out, with the unicameral system, if we had it
20 and if it were on the Supreme Court guideline of one man-
21 one vote and if we further went into the idea that every
