county would have home rule, I think the last session, in my opinion at least, was a pretty good reason why I would think many of the smaller counties and, quite frankly, Baltimore City, at this time, at this point would be a little suspicious of it.

The equalization, which is a must, to many areas perhaps would be in great jeopardy and I would hate to think that Caroline County or Queen Anne's or Somerset or Baltimore City wouldn't have some say in the distribution of those programs that are supposed to be on an equalization formula, rather than rely on the wisdom and good will of Prince George's, Baltimore County, Harford, Anne Arundel and the growing areas and this is, I think, something that many people are going to take a long, hard look at; but if you had the unicameral system and if we had the one man-one vote, I think that many of our smaller areas and the Baltimore City status quo is going to remain and I think we would be left, well, to the good intentions of the larger areas and maybe their good intentions wouldn't carry through the philosophy of the equalization by which we must live, and I think I should add that

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
