2 think if you build home rule, put compulsory home rule
3 into your Constitution, I think the business of repre-
4 senting counties in the legislature becomes relatively
5 unimportant. So that, I think -- of course, I've advo-
6 cated a unicameral system and, if you do that, then you
7 simply have to draw your lines to accommodate people and
8 not political subdivisions because you cannot draw your
9 district lines and meet this court decision and follow
10 county lines, that's all. It's just an impossibility.
