2 constitution, I believe that any constitution should be

15 I think the less you do by constitution and
16 the more you do by statute, the better off you are; but
17 what I say is, to get practical, I think it is wonderful
18 in theory to try to get everything that you can do to
19 make it a better document, but I also think you have to
20 look at the practical aspect of it; that you want the
21 people to adopt a new constitution and in order to get
