you have to be practical. First, when you are writing a 1 constitution, I believe that any constitution should be 2 written as briefly as possible. I think the less you put 3 into it, the better document you are going to have. 4 that I mean, I don't think you go into all these areas 5 and write everything into a constitution because then 6 you are going to have nothing but trouble, and we have 7 seen it time and time again. That is why we have had to 8 amend the Constitution so many times, because we write 9 constitutional amendments down there and after they are 10 adopted, then we find out we either left something out 11 or should put something in. So, again we go and adopt 12 another constitutional amendment to make up for the 13 mistakes. 14

I think the less you do by constitution and the more you do by statute, the better off you are; but what I say is, to get practical, I think it is wonderful in theory to try to get everything that you can do to make it a better document, but I also think you have to look at the practical aspect of it; that you want the people to adopt a new constitution and in order to get
