

1 two senators or assemblymen and these would be people
2 fairly close to the people, but not necessarily repre-
3 senting along county lines.

4 On the bicameral situation, I personally feel
5 that the House should be cut down to 80 or 90, and the
6 Senate to about 43, if we were having a bicameral system.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: You would make the House 90
8 and the Senate about how large?

9 SENATOR JAMES: About 40. I think the House
10 should be about twice the size of the Senate.

11 SENATOR HUGHES: That would do away with the
12 guarantee of one for each county in the House.

13 SENATOR JAMES: That's right.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Emanuel?

15 DELEGATE EMANUEL: One brief comment. I can
16 see from the standpoint of leadership in the houses,
17 sitting on my left, where the smaller house is more
18 convenient and more efficient to work with, but from the
19 standpoint of one of the lesser members of the house,
20 I've sat in committees where I've heard it said that a
21 35-member committee was too much and unwieldy and I found
