14 term would be a necessity and I wouldn't like the  
15 staggering, from the aspect of being a member of either  
16 the House or the Senate, if it were bicameral, because  
17 I think that the senators or the members of the House  
18 who were going to stay for the additional two years,  
19 say if it were a four-year staggered term, to a four-  
20 year basis, that they would have to a degree a weapon  
21 that they could use in negotiating on particular bills
