the legislature, by the time he really finds the various ways to do things in the legislature, his term would be up or 18 months of his term would be up and he would be starting to campaign for reelection.

I can remember when I ran four years ago, when we ran for congressman. It seemed like a day or two later, the same congressmen were running for election two years later and by that time I felt I was really getting my feet on the ground in the legislature and starting to learn where to go and how to do things. At this time, I could have my duties complicated with the campaign or have it take part of my attention away from I feel the same as Mr. Moore, that the four-year term would be a necessity and I wouldn't like the staggering, from the aspect of being a member of either the House or the Senate, if it were bicameral, because I think that the senators or the members of the House who were going to stay for the additional two years, say if it were a four-year staggered term, to a fouryear basis, that they would have to a degree a weapon that they could use in negotiating on particular bills
