DELEGATE MANDEL: I would.

THE CHAIRMAN: But to fifteen days?

DELEGATE MANDEL: Yes.

MR. ENEY: Is there any reason why you couldn't say the budget has to be passed in 30 days or 45 days or some relative short time?

DELEGATE MANDEL: You haven't got time to look at it. We're dealing with an executive budget, the Governor's budget. The first look the legislature gets at that budget is the day it is presented to it. That is the only time the legislature gets a look at the Governor's budget. This is the Governor's budget, not the legislature's. So, we have no part in the makeup of the budget. The first look we get at it is from the Governor when the legislature goes into session.

So, I think you have to have a sufficient period of time for the legislature to take a look at the budget.

THE CHAIRMAN: Let's get some comments from the other members of the State Legislature. Mr. Kircher?
