has to be a constitutional limitation rather than just 1 a statutory limitation? I would visualize or I would 2 hope, as Mr. Hardwicke said, that this Constitution 3 would be drawn and would last for quite a long time, that we're spending a lot of time on it now and that 5 it would be good for a number of years. Why could it 6 not be a statutory provision that could be modified 7 easily so with any change in the State makeup. 8 THE CHAIRMAN: You mean the length of the 9 sessions? 10 11 DELEGATE KIRCHER: Length of the session, 12 limitation as to number of days, rather than being a 13 specific constitutional provision. It would have to 14 go all the way through a constitutional amendment, say 15 10 or 15 years from now when possibly, as Mr. Hardwicke pointed out, we may go into a different form of govern-16 ment. 17 THE CHAIRMAN: If you were writing the 18

Constitution, how would you write this particular clause?

DELEGATE KIRCHER: That this would be provided by law, the same as the salaries.
