Chairman Clagett said that he detected general agreement on the part of the Committee members that the county should be the basic unit of government, as of that point. He agreed with Judge Adkins not to pin down the future of what local governments should look like too explicitly in any proposed constitutional revision. He also at this point raised the question, he said the Committee must face up to the question whether local government, whether the creation of local government should be made in the Legislature or whether power to create new units of local governments should be given to local bodies themselves.

Consultant Loevy raised the question of abolishing small cities and the further question of just how many small cities there were in Maryland and to what extent their powers existed. Mrs. Freedlander agreed on the abolition of small cities as being in many cases largely unrealistic units of government. Consultant Loevy at this point raised the question of a definition for the concept of home rule, whether home rule powers should be clearly laid out in the Constitution or should be left to
