What he is saying is instead of having a constitutional amendment to change the length of term, the legislature can do it, but effective only for the next term. You can never change the length of your current term.

DELEGATE MANDEL: That might have some merit.

THE CHAIRMAN: Do you want to comment on that?

DELEGATE EMANUEL: Before you pass this subject of the length of session, you seem to think it was
unanimous or a great deal of sentiment was --

Some consensus, not unanimous.

THE CHAIRMAN:

DELEGATE EMANUEL: I would like to point out one thing for your consideration and that is this, if we do run into a unicameral legislature and we do streamline our methods and we eliminate an awful lot of the waste of time that we do have, that it might very well be that a 70-day session could accomplish its purpose. There is a tendency, I think, on the part of all of us, when the Federal Government changed the filing date of income tax from March 15 to April 15, you wondered how did we do it by March 15, because people have the tendency to procrastinate to the last possible moment.
