3 You would have the State legislature continue, would you?

4 SENATOR JAMES: I'm not too impressed with
5 the work of the State legislature generally speaking in
6 reapportioning itself. It has built-in self-interests
7 that are difficult to overlook. It's awfully difficult
8 for a member of the legislature to look at a fellow
9 legislator and say, we're going to reapportion you out
10 of office. It's practically an impossible task to ask
11 a man to do that. We did it under court pressure, but
12 I'm not too impressed with the idea of the legislature
13 reapportioning itself.

14 DELEGATE MANDEL: What a beautiful way for a
15 Governor to create a kind of dynasty, with the Governor
16 doing the reapportionment.

17 THE CHAIRMAN: Under the model plan, the
18 Governor does it through an advisory committee.

19 DELEGATE MANDEL: You know, these committees
20 sometimes don't impress me, Doctor, because the kind of
21 advice you get is sometimes the kind you want, and I just
