1 and --MR. RENNIE: Well, let me tell you of another 2 experience. When the National Association of Budget 3 Officers was formed, about eighteen, twenty years ago, they v 4 had nineteen or twenty sessions, now, they wanted a repre-5 sentative from Maryland to attend the initial incorporation 6 meeting in Chicago. Kirkman was a purchasing man primarily. 7 He had been President of the National Association of 8 Purchasing Agents and one thing and another. He said, 9 Rennie, I'm not going up there. He said, those people turn-10 over so fast. You meet one group and teach them all you 11 know and go back the next year and they have had an election 12 in the State and you have an entirely new group to face and 13 work with. He said, you go up. He said, I'll stick to the 14 purchasing agents. So, he sent me to the meeting. 15 I went to the meeting and during that initial 16 meeting I asked the question of the group assembled there, 17 and I think there were about twenty some States that 18 appeared at that first meeting, I asked, I want to know 19 what your state of employment is, as to the budget officers 20 here, whether you are subject to political vicissitudes or 21
