governmental units, permissive legislation would be needed by the Legislature, not in the Constitution, perhaps.

Resolving all city-county conflicts in favor of counties; I think I can answer that easily, yes, and my good friend Mr. Thompson might perhaps go the other way on it. I think here again we have to know what the conflicts are we are talking about. Certainly, there are many patterns of city-county areas of services where there are conflicts, but I think the more you provide the means of settling on a local level, the better off you are.

You can never legislate cooperation, except by hitting somebody over the head, and I'm never really in favor of hitting people over the head unless I have to.

Whether to give local subdivisions complete
financial authority; personally, I don't think this should
be. I think one of the things that we have been fortunate about in Maryland is that our Constitution does
not stipulate many financial provisions in it, other than
the State budget provision, the State bond issues; but,
as far as tax limits, taxation, we have not been hampered
