Sure. The Governor could do anything MR. RENNIE: 1 he wanted with it. 2 MR. SACHS: Could I ask one short question. gentlemen? MR. RENNIE: It's purely permissive. 5 MR. SACHS: Mr. Rennie, Mr. Slicher, we talked 6 before about what impediments, if any, the mandatory 7 aspects of the education budget, as a constitutional matter, 8 might present, and I think I understand your reactions to 9 that. 10 Do you have any special reactions to the fact 11 12 that the judicial and the legislative budgets are also mandatory, can not be revised by the Governor? Has that 13 14 in practice proven difficult, in this Constitution? MR. SLICHER: No, because the judiciary of its very 15 nature has been very cooperative. As a matter of fact. 16 it is up to almost the deadline of the date that we have 17 to go to the printer with it. If there is some adjustment 18 downward, they don't hesitate to call us and say, well, 19 now, we've got so much money in here for retirement, the 20 judges and judges! wives.
