4 They come along and they say, the Governor hasn't

9 MR. RENNIE: Indigent Court costs.

10 MR. SLICHER: Yes, and this has gone out of
11 sight since the bill was inaugurated. It started with
12 something like \$5,000 and I think we spent something like
13 \$100,000 a year on that.

14 MR. SACHS: As a partial beneficiary of that
15 fund, I don't want to quarrel with you.

16 MR. RENNIE: Again, the judiciary budget is
17 almost all controlled by law. The State judges' salaries
18 are set, the number of judges are set by law. You have
19 to pass a law to get another judge appointed. There might
20 be too many judges. I don't know.
