law.

MR. BENTON: Right.

you can have a bond issue, and if you are going to give that kind of liberty to Prince George's, even though it is very big and a sophisticated county, it seems to me you will have to give it to Carroll County which is smaller and becoming sophisticated and still have to go into Garrett County, where you've got perhaps more of a rural situation.

THE CHAIRMAN: And you have to have a law before

MR. BENTON: By contrast, none of the municipali-

ties except Baltimore City need to go to the legislature to create a debt, no matter how large or how small they may be.

THE CHAIRMAN: That is because, of course, you have complete home rule for the municipalities, and it seems to me that where you have complete home rule, then your recommendation is consistent; but where you don't have complete home rule and where the legislature has not vested in the local elected officials the power to pass laws, then it seems to me that your recommendation ought

perhaps be confined to the places where there has been
