1 Municipal Court through the court costs, the fines going 2 to the State and costs coming indirectly to the City. So, there are many areas of revenues that we would be forfeiting, 5 THE CHAIRMAN: You would be forfeiting quite 6 a bundle in the Traffic Court, wouldn't you? It's well 7 over a million dollars. 8 MR. BENTON: That is correct, but there would 9 bе 10 THE CHAIRMAN: You get \$4 for every case. 11 whether a fine is levied or not, don't you? What sense 12 does that make? 13 MR. BENTON: We receive the fine resulting from 14 the violation of a municipal ordinance, such as parking 15 violations. 16 THE CHAIRMAN: You get all of that. 17 MR.
