merely because of the requirement that non-profit organizations had to be sponsoring corporations in order to
receive the Federal subsidy, but the net result of the
Federal Act has been the creation of a number of enterprises
in order to receive the benefit of Federal financial assistance, which have also now got as the tail end factor the
benefit of local property tax exemption.

So that we have projects, apartment buildings, going up sponsored by churches and unions and other non-profit organizations which will be charging rents of 100, \$150 a month or more to people who are not necessarily deemed to be needy, but for whom there is a need to provide moderate income housing.

At the same time we have this set of circumstances we have the Federal Government involved in a system of finance, in the same housing act, but an older version of it, for public housing. The Federal Government in this case insists that the local government must enter into an agreement with the local housing authority as to the nature of payments in lieu of taxes to be paid by that local housing authority in order that the amount of tax subsidy
