of persons owning property, or with respect to any particular uses of property, I think the provisions of tax exemption or I would hope credits and abatements would be uniform State-wide.

I think that the State of Maryland should not enact legislation in behalf of or for or to any political subdivision which removes from them the right to make decisions which are essentially local in character with respect to tax policy.

Let me give you an example. Even seeming aspects of uniformity are not uniform in their results. You have a law that says that blind people are entitled to \$6,000 of exemption on their homes. This is uniform. Every blind person throughout the State who owns a home is entitled to this. In the present situation, it is uniform, but it is foolish, because people with greater disability than blindness, a completely paralyzed man, for example, is not given the benefit of this kind of tax treatment.

We have an arbitrary but uniform State-wide
law and I would suggest if it is possible in your wisdom to
devise the language, the result of which would be to aim

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
