

1 MR. BOND: Not at all. I was unsuccessful in
2 housing for the elderly. May I say again, I agree with
3 what you say, but where do you distinguish between housing
4 for the elderly and old folks' homes? That's an awfully
5 thin line to draw.

6 MRS. HOFFMAN: It is a thin line to draw and I'm
7 glad it's within my province to point up problems at the
8 moment and not necessarily to solve them, but I think these
9 are very important considerations which are becoming greater,
10 which you should not fail to deal with. Let me give you an
11 example of a bill that was introduced into the City Council,
12 that is under consideration now and may receive second
13 greeting on Monday, though I trust not, in the form intro-
14 duced and, Mr. Bond, I presume that you are interested in
15 the historical preservation and --

16 MR. BOND: No. That's Tom Ward. I wouldn't
17 get into that.

20 a matter of public policy to determine that landmarks should
21 not be destroyed or that they should be protected in one
