transitional society. I think it is inequitable not to . 1 2 give them some kind of benefit but it should be open, it should be expressed in terms of a credit or an abatement, 3 and one should know precisely how much is involved with 5 respect to various types of property. I don't know what has happened --THE CHAIRMAN: In other words, you would agree 8 there should be something for the farmers --MRS. HOFFMAN: As a matter of public policy, 10 we have to take care of them, but I think the particular 11 technique we have used is one that lends itself to abuse 12 and to extension. 13 THE CHAIRMAN: Very good. 14 MR. RENNIE: Didn't we pass some State law in 15 the past couple of years on that, down in Annapolis? 16 THE CHAIRMAN: It was proposed, but not --17 MRS. HOFFMAN: Tax credits to the elderly only. 18 MR. SACHS: On the farm land, it was proposed. 19 MR. RENNIE: Well, I have a recommendation to 20 make to the Committee. 21 THE CHAIRMAN: Shoot.
