and a problem and I think the question is well put and certainly is one that should be answered.

Number seven, whether to provide for resolving all city-county conflicts in favor of anybody, I would say no. I think that one should attempt to resolve conflicts in favor of those persons who are served by the government; that is to say, the citizens of the local government, and it might very well be that in a particular area the conflict should be resolved one way, in one question, or one area of conflict, and in a different way in a different area of conflict. I guess I didn't answer that question as precisely as Mr. Ratchford. Nonetheless, I attempted to answer it with some similarity to his prediction.

Question No. 8, whether to give local subdivisions complete financial authority; I believe there
should be fairly broad authority given to subdivisions.

This again relates, and I think so many of these questions
are interrelated, and I commend those persons who prepared this list because I know it is very difficult to
isolate these issues because, after all, they are related.
