organization of the State. You are not proposing that 1 the Constitution provide this sort of organization? 2 MR. LAUBER: This is true. I don't know. .3 haven't really examined it to see whether perhaps something 4 in the Constitution might be necessary to enable such an 5 organization to exist. I would think certainly the 6 details should be in the legislation. Whether there is 7 a necessity for anything in the Constitution, I don't know. 8 DR. JENKINS: Well, this is a new Commission 9 that is going to look over the whole government. 10 MR. LAUBER: What I am really concerned with is 11 one thing that is set in the Constitution which is the 12 Governor's salary, and if the Governor's salary said 12,000 13 DR. JENKINS: Not this time. 14 MR. LAUBER: If you set the Governor's salary 15 at \$12,000, it obviously becomes impossible to hire au 16 executive for \$40,000. 17 DR. JENKINS: Well, I think that is one thing 18 the Commission will agree on. 19
