2 the Constitution provide this sort of organization?

3 MR. LAUBER: This is true. I don't know. I
4 haven't really examined it to see whether perhaps something
5 in the Constitution might be necessary to enable such an
6 organization to exist. I would think certainly the
7 details should be in the legislation. Whether there is
8 a necessity for anything in the Constitution, I don't know.

9 DR. JENKINS: Well, this is a new Commission
10 that is going to look over the whole government.

11 MR. LAUBER: What I am really concerned with is
12 one thing that is set in the Constitution which is the
13 Governor's salary, and if the Governor's salary said 12,000

14 DR. JENKINS: Not this time.

15 MR. LAUBER: If you set the Governor's salary
16 at \$12,000, it obviously becomes impossible to hire an
17 executive for \$40,000.

18 DR. JENKINS: Well, I think that is one thing
19 the Commission will agree on.
