these officials who share power and who share it not only
constitutionally, but also through statute, such as the
Board of Public Works, which further diffuses responsibilities
in the State. This is something I hope this Constitutional
Commission abolishes forthwith.

THE CHAIRMAN: The Board of Public Works?

MR. DONAHO: Yes, which is an awful thing, a waste of time. In other States, where there are strong executives, where the executives are able to exercise authority, they too would not, through their allotment

systems, permit the executive agencies, particularly the

executive agencies, to spend above that which they in their
wisdom as chief executive have seen fit to originally de-

There is a corollary situation which you probably should carefully consider, which I mention in my written statement, whether this authority should extent to the Judicial and Legislative Departments. As you know, they are now, the judiciary is exempted and the legislative group is exempted from the Governor's determination, which is consistent with the idea of the separation of power.
