MR. DONAHO: Yes. 1 MR. BOND: In the Executive Department? 2 MR. DONAHO: In the Executive Department. 3 THE CHAIRMAN: As he views it, there are many officials in the Executive Department that whittle away 5 at the Governor's powers. 6 MR. DONAHO: That's right. I say this because 7 in the process of big government, and Maryland has arrived 8 at the State of big government and we're getting bigger 9 by the moment, and the public sector in our economy is not 10 going to shrink, it is going to continue to grow and maybe 11. at an alarming rate, and the only instrument we have, the 12 one opportunity we have, unfortunately, and fortunately we 13 have it annually, is to review the entire program of what 14 the government is going to do, what it's going to cost, 15 how much are they going to do, how the work of one agency 16 relates to another. This is at the time that the annual 17 budget is being formulated and subsequently presented to the 18 legislature and enacted by the legislature. 19 This is our one and only opportunity to make 20 a review of the things that the government not only has the 21
